What is the purpose of the Bible?

The Westminster Shorter Catechism, an important Presbyterian Catechism from the seventeenth century, ask: "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" The answer: "The Scriptures Principally teach what man is to believe concerning God, and what duty God requires of man" (BC 7.003). This is the Bible's purpose: to teach us what to believe and how to live.

We see these foci in two biblical verses, one each from the New and Old Testaments. The Gospel of John concludes by saying that Jesus did many other signs "which are not written in this book." But, "these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:31). The church has seen this purpose as extending to the Bible as a whole. Here, as nowhere else, we find the witness of faith to Jesus as God's Son, the Messiah. Through the Scriptures, we come to believe in Jesus Christ and to have the "life" God intends us to have, through him. This, we believe.

The second verse is a high point of the Old Testament ethics. The prophet Micha proclaims what God requires: "He has told you, O Mortal, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (Mic. 6:8). This is the duty and purpose for living of those created by God. We are to uphold what is right in accord with God's will, act in ways that convey the mercy and faithfulness of God, and thus to live in humble obedience and fellowship with the Lord. This, God desires.

Presbyterians see the Bible as our source for the unique knowledge and understandings indicated here. The Bible is our way of knowing what to believe about God and supremely what God has done in Jesus Christ. We learn this nowhere else than in the Scriptures. Sometimes the term "infallible" is used to designate this conviction that the Bible will not lead us astray in what to believe. Here also we find how God wants us to live. God's law is revealed to show us God's will. As a Christians, we obey God's law out of gratitude for God's love. Put simply; the one who loves "has fulfilled the law" (Rom. 13:8). So the Bible is the incomparable basis to enable our beliefs and our actions to be united.

Deacons Corner

I have been asked to share information on the St. James Community Food Locker which Calvary has been a part of for over ten years. During that time you have been asked to donate non-perishable food items or a monetary contribution.

Many of you know about the food locker, but I would like to take this opportunity to share a little of it's history. The community food locker was started in the mid 80's headed by Jan Arenz and faithful volunteers at St. James Episcopal. The inventory started with a few cans on the shelf and has grown to serve approximately 50 families or individuals each week. Recently this has included 8 to 12 homeless people, whom the volunteers make a special effort to help with their unique needs.

The food locker is supported by the community of South Pasadena. For more than 15 years, they have been the recipient of the Middle School annual fall food collection- as well as the collection by the Postal Carriers Union each May. They are grateful for the support of the people of Calvary Presbyterian, their own parish of St. James, the South Pasadena Women's Club, and individuals of the community. Food is distributed every Friday which includes produce from the local farmers' market, bakery items from Vons and Pavilions, plus miscellaneous food items. With funds, bulk items such as fresh oranges, rice and bean are purchased and broken down into one-pound baggies. Every Friday morning a group of volunteers lays out the produce and bread for people to choose from, and assemble bags of the miscellaneous items. From 1:30 to 2:30, another group oversees the giving out of the food.

Here at Calvary, your Deacons are in-charge of taking the non-perishable food items that you place in the food baskets to St. James. A deacon is assigned each month to deliver the items and in addition, after checking with Jan, purchase specific items that their inventory may need. We also purchase hams for Easter and turkeys for Thanksgiving. Your monetary gifts that you place in those bright green envelopes in the pew holders, are used for that purpose. Your Deacons thank you for your years- of dedication and support. In addition, I would like to read a note from Jan to our Deacons and congregation.

Jan has been a true disciple and it is with regret that I share the news that after 30 years of heading up the food locker, she will be retiring, staying long enough for the new director to transition into the job, which will continue to be a volunteer position. We all wish her a well-earned rest.

So, in honor of Jan and helping the less fortunate, let's keep the food donations abundant as well as filling those green envelopes. Thank you.


